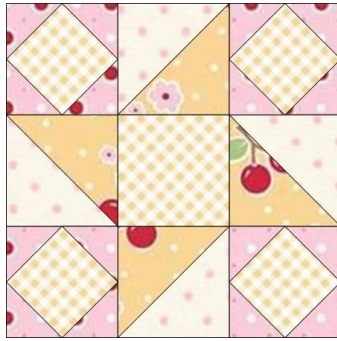

Finished Size: 12" x 12"

Cutting Directions

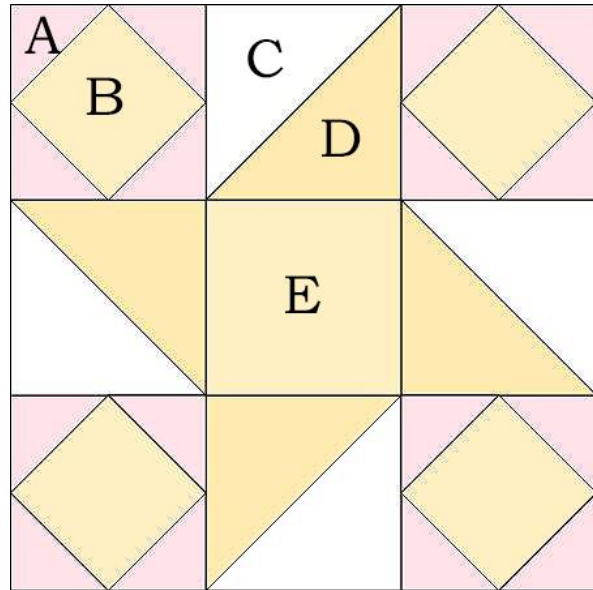


From Pink fabric cut:
A-(cut 16) 2 1/2" x 2 1/2"

From Yellow #1 fabric:
B-(cut 4) 4 1/2" x 4 1/2"
E-(cut 1) 4 1/2" x 4 1/2"

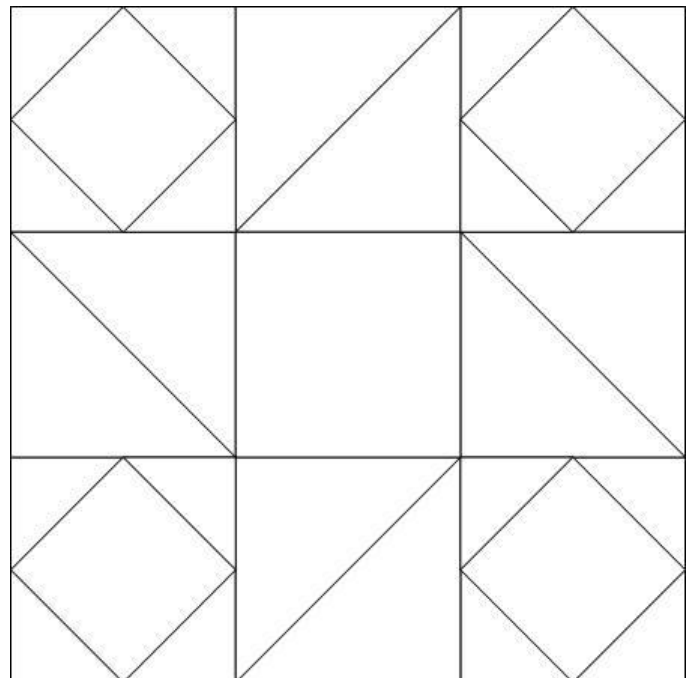
From Yellow #2 fabric cut:
D-(cut 2) 5 1/8" x 5 1/8"

From Background fabric cut:
C-(cut 2) 5 1/8" x 5 1/8"



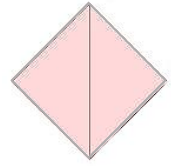
Note: If you are making the queen size quilt you will need to make two of this block.

Color it Your Way

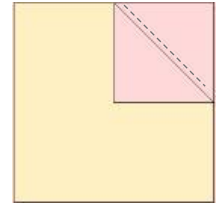


Making the Corner Units

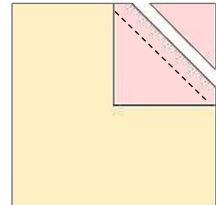
(1) Begin by drawing a diagonal line on the back of the A squares using a pencil.



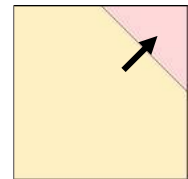
(2) Place an A square in a corner of each B square. Make sure the diagonal line is going in the right direction. Sew right along the line, just a needle width to the outside of it. (See dotted line.) Be sure you sew on the outside of the line, towards the corner of the square, and not on the inside as your triangle will be too small.



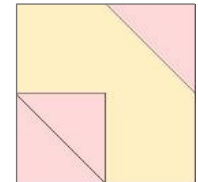
(3) Flip the triangle over to make sure that it covers the entire corner. It should cover the corner of the B square completely. Using a rotary cutter trim off ¼” from the seam line.



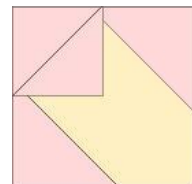
(4) Press towards A as shown by arrow.



(5) Add another A square to the opposite corner. Sew and press in the same way.

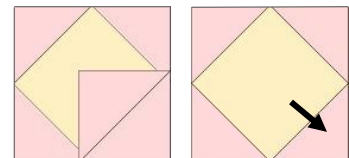


(6) Repeat with a third A square.



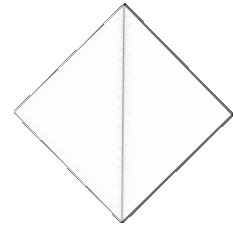
(7) Now add the final A square to the last corner.

The Corner Units measure 4 ½” x 4 ½”.

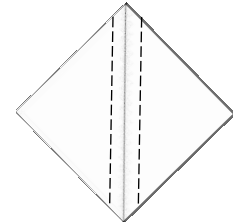


Making the Half-square Triangles

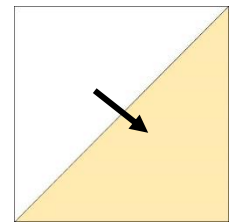
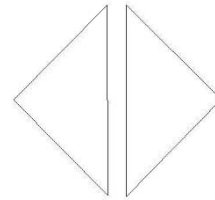
(1) Draw a diagonal line on the back of each C square.
Place the C squares on the D squares right sides together.



(2) Sew $\frac{1}{4}$ " from each side of the drawn line.



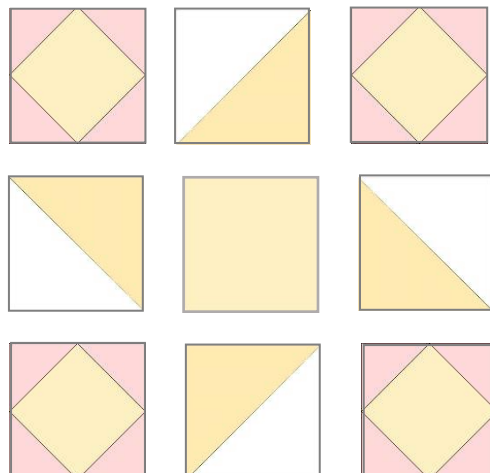
(3) Cut apart on drawn line and press towards D as indicated by arrows.



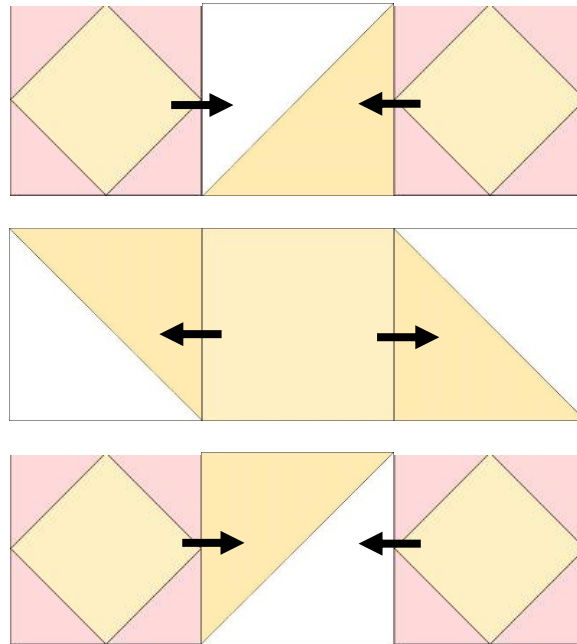
(4) Trim units to $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ ".

Putting the Block Together

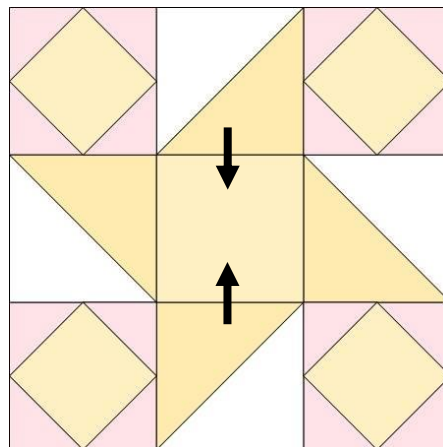
(1) Lay out the Half-square Triangles, Corner Units and E square as shown. Watch the direction of the Quarter-square Triangles in particular as it is easy to get them turned the wrong direction.



(2) Join together into rows. Press as indicated.



(3) Join the rows together matching seams and pinning as desired. Press as indicated to finish the block.



The block now measures 12½" x 12½"

Note: this is not the finished size but has a seam allowance.

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However, it does help me out a lot when you do.
