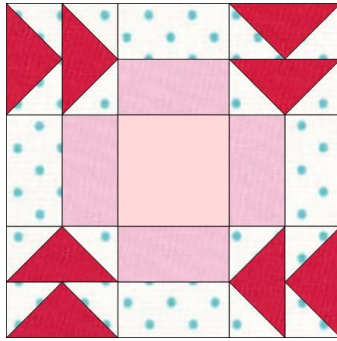

Block 9: Apple Pie



Finished Size: 12" x 12"

Cutting Directions



From Red fabric cut:

A-(cut 2) 5½" x 5½"

From Background fabric cut:

B-(cut 8) 3⅛" x 3⅛"

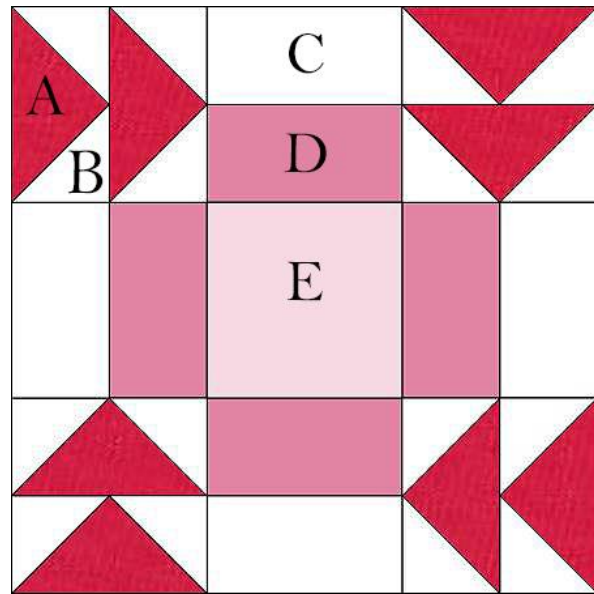
C-(cut 4) 2½" x 4½"

From Pink #1 fabric cut:

D-(cut 4) 2½" x 4½"

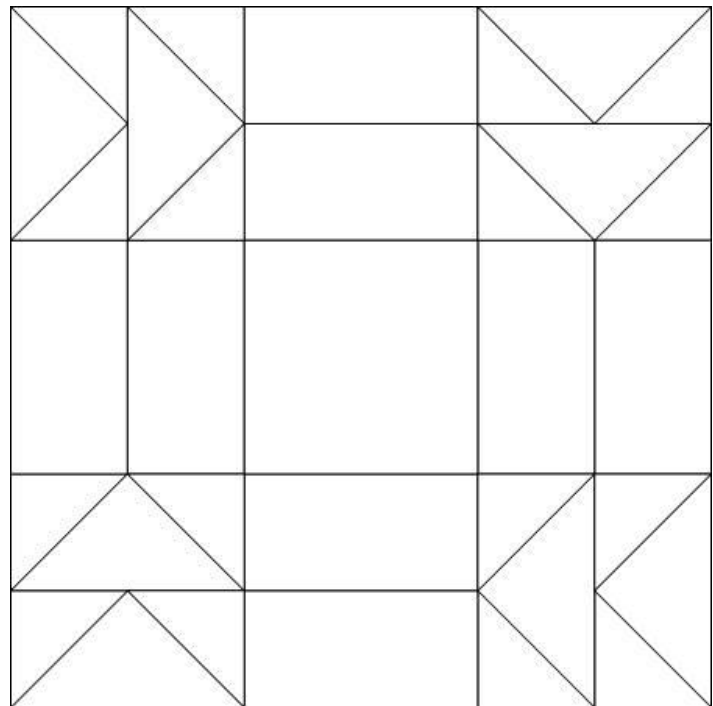
From Pink #2 fabric cut:

E-(cut 1) 4½" x 4½"



Note: If you are making the queen size quilt you will need to make only one of this block.

Color it Your Way

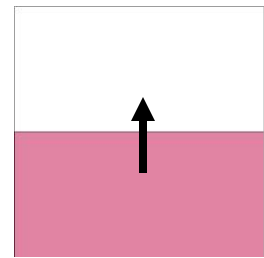




Making the Rectangle Pairs



Join the C and D rectangles together as shown.
Press towards C. (I usually prefer pressing to the dark side, but for ease in piecing the block together I am making an exception here.)



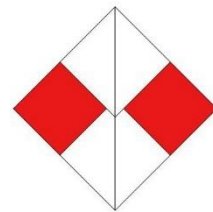
You will have a total of four of these units which should measure 4½” x 4½”.



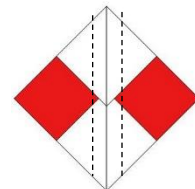
Making the Flying Geese Units



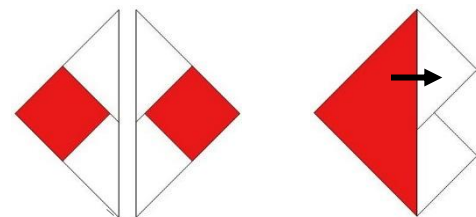
(1) Place two B squares on top of each A square as shown.
Draw a diagonal line across both B squares.



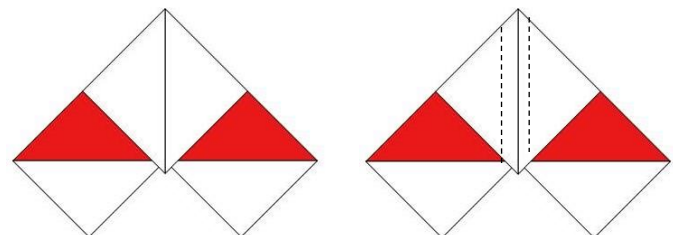
(2) Sew ¼” from each side of the drawn line.



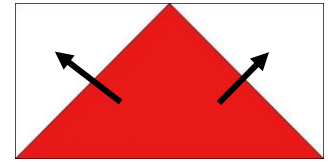
(3) Cut apart on the drawn line. Press towards the B triangles as indicated by arrows.



(4) Lay another B square on top of the units just made, as shown. Draw a diagonal line down the middle and sew ¼” from each side of the line.

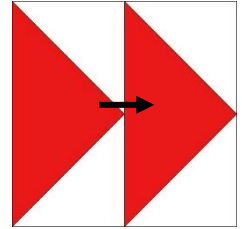


(5) Cut apart on the drawn line and press towards the small triangles as indicated. You will have four Flying Geese units.



(6) Trim the Flying Geese units to $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ ". You will make a total of eight of these Flying Geese units.

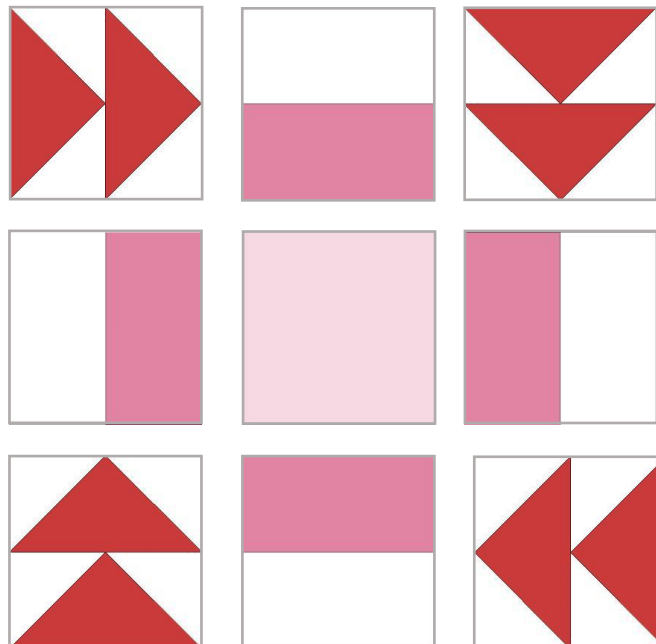
(7) Join the Flying Geese units into pairs as shown to create four of these units. Press as indicated.



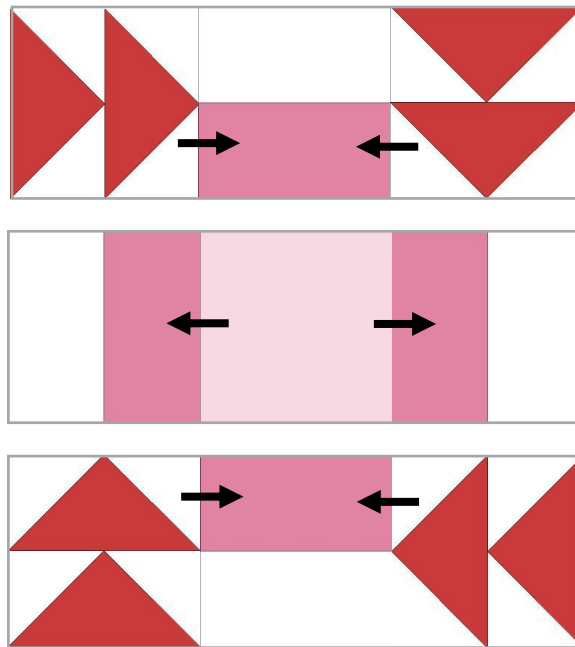
These units should now measure $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ ".

Putting the Block Together

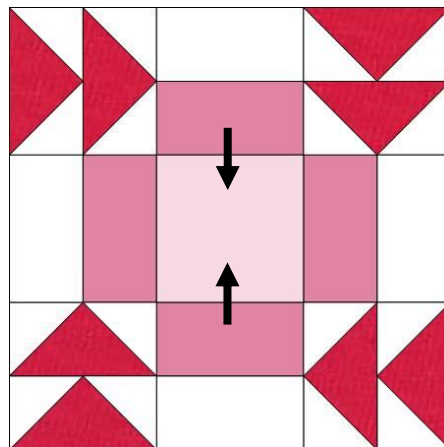
(1) Lay out the Flying Geese Units, the Rectangle Unit, and the E square as shown. Watch the direction of the Flying Geese Units to be sure they are each going in the right direction.



(2) Join together into rows matching seams. Press as indicated.



(3) Join the rows together matching seams and pinning as desired. Sew slowly over those bulky seams. Press as indicated to finish the block.



The unfinished size of this block now measures 12½" x 12½"

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Any physical items you create with my patterns are yours and there are no restrictions on what you can do with them. So go ahead and enter them in show, sell them, donate them for auctions, etc. You are not required to mention Debra Davis or Tuning My Heart Quilts in any way.
