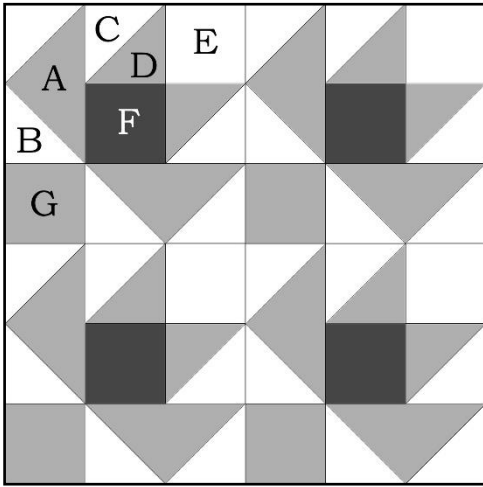


Passing the Days: 90-Darting Birds



Cutting Directions:

Light Fabric:

B (cut 8) $2\frac{1}{8}$ " x $2\frac{1}{8}$ "

C (cut 4) 2" x 2"

E (cut 4) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $1\frac{1}{2}$ "

Medium Fabric:

A (cut 2) $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ "

D (cut 4) 2" x 2"

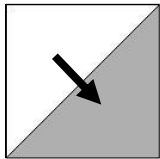
G (cut 4) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $1\frac{1}{2}$ "

Dark Fabric:

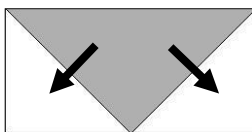
F (cut 4) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $1\frac{1}{2}$ "

Directions: (Press as indicated by arrows.)

1. Use the C and D squares to make eight Half-square Triangles. Trim to $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $1\frac{1}{2}$ ".

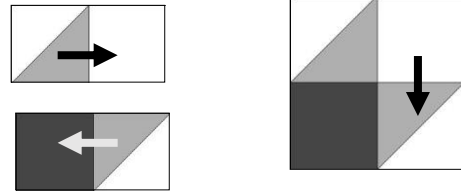


2. Use the A and B squares to make eight Flying Geese units. (See General Directions for specific instructions for making No-waste Flying Geese.) Trim to $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $2\frac{1}{2}$ ".



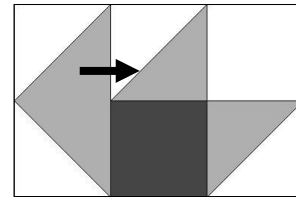
3. Use the E and F squares with the Half-square Triangles to make four 4-patch units as shown.

These units measure $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $2\frac{1}{2}$ ".

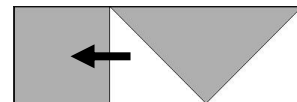


4. Add a Flying Geese unit to the left side of each 4-patch.

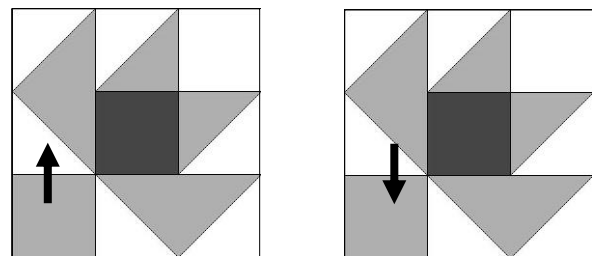
The unit now measures $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $2\frac{1}{2}$ ".



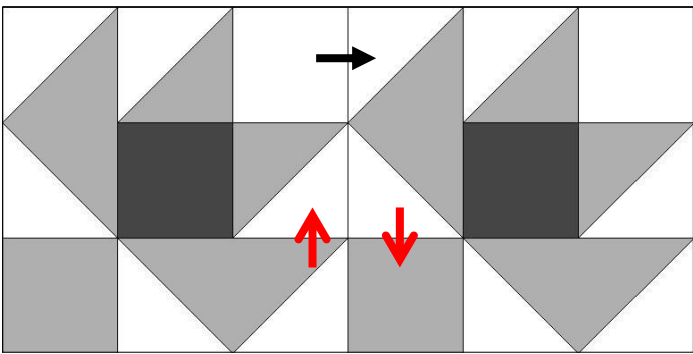
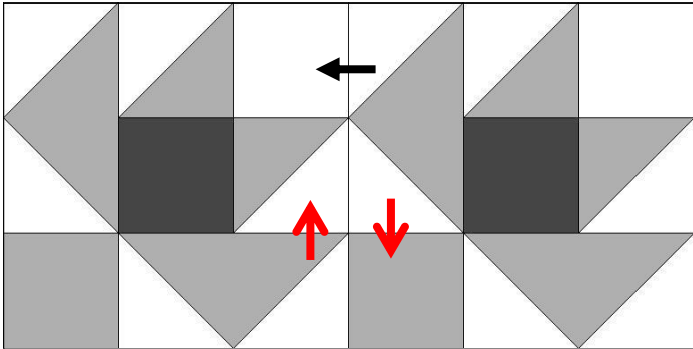
5. Add the G squares to the remaining Flying Geese units.



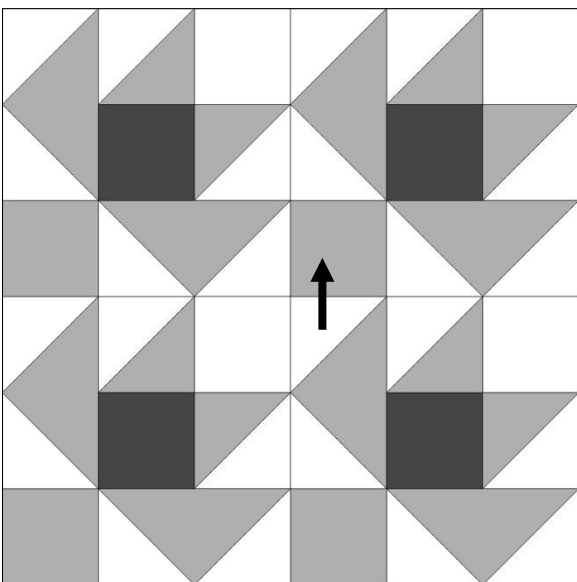
6. Join the units from Step 4 and Step 5 as shown. Press two of them in one direction and two in the opposite direction. This unit measures $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ ".



7. Lay out the four units as shown and join into two pairs. Match the seams for each pair so that they lock together (This is why we pressed two of each in opposite directions. These seams are indicated by the red arrows.)



8. Join the units to complete the block. Block measures 6½” x 6½” unfinished.



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
