MATERIALS

- FQ Blue
- FQ Green (or various scraps)
- 1½" x 1½" Brown
- 7" x 3" Tiny Floral Print

Cutting Directions:

From Blue fabric:

- A-(cut 2) 2½" x 1½"
- B-(cut 10) 1½" x 1½"
- C-(cut 2) 2" x 1½"
- D-(cut 2) 1½" x 1½"
- E-(cut 2) 1½" x 1"
- K-(cut 2) 3" x 1"

From Green fabric(s):


- F-(cut 1) 2½" x 1½"
- G-(cut 1) 3½" x 1½"
- H-(cut 1) 4½" x 1½"
- I-(cut 1) 5½" x 1½"
- J-(cut 1) 6½" x 1½"

From Brown fabric:

- M-(cut 1) 1½" x 1½"

From Floral fabric:

- L-(cut 2) 3" x 1"



TIP


Have you changed your rotary cutting blade recently? A new blade can make a huge difference in how easily your fabric cuts.

Piecing Directions


1. Begin by drawing a diagonal line on the back of each B square. Use a pencil that will not show through your fabric.

TIP


Placing the fabric squares on a piece of very fine sandpaper helps keep them from shifting while you draw the line.




2. Place the B square, right sides together, on the F rectangle as shown. Pay particular attention to the direction the diagonal line is going.




3. Stitch just to the outside of the drawn line. You do not want to sew right on top of the line.





4. Trim away the excess, 1/4" from the stitching.



5. Press towards the small triangle as indicated by arrow.




6. Repeat steps 2-5 with a second B square on the other side. This unit should measure $2\frac{1}{2}'' \times 1\frac{1}{2}''$.

7. Add an A rectangle to each side of the unit and press as indicated by arrows.



$6\frac{1}{2}'' \times 1\frac{1}{2}''$


8. Repeat this process using the following combinations.



$6\frac{1}{2}'' \times 1\frac{1}{2}''$





9. Repeat steps 1-6 to attach the two remaining B squares to J rectangle.




$6\frac{1}{2}'' \times 1\frac{1}{2}''$


10. Join the K and L rectangles and press towards K. You will have two units.



11. Join these units with the M square as shown. Press towards M.




12. Lay out all of the units in order from top to bottom. Join into pairs, pressing as indicated.



13. Sew these rows together to complete the block.

Press as indicated by arrows.

Unfinished block measures 6 1/2" x 6 1/2".




